The Council of Ministers makes the following Regulations under sections 7 and 12 of the European Union and Trade Act 2019.

1 Title

These Regulations are the European Union and Trade Act 2019 (Retained Direct EU Legislation) (DEFA and OFT) Regulations 2019.

2 Commencement

If approved by Tynwald, these Regulations come into operation on exit day¹.

3 Prescribed EU regulations, EU decisions and EU tertiary legislation

- (1) The EU regulations, EU decisions and EU tertiary legislation specified in the Schedule, as they have effect in EU law immediately before exit day, are prescribed for the purposes of section 7(1) of the European Union and Trade Act 2019.
- (2) To avoid doubt, the EU regulations, EU decisions and EU tertiary legislation prescribed under regulation 3(1) include any adaptations made to such EU regulations, EU decisions and EU tertiary legislation under the EEA agreement and which have effect immediately before exit day.

4 Interpretation of prescribed EU regulations, EU decisions and EU tertiary legislation

- (1) Throughout the EU regulations, EU decisions and EU tertiary legislation prescribed under regulation 3(1) and unless the context otherwise requires –
 - (a) references to “Member State”, “Member States”, the “Community”, the “European Union”, the “EU” and the “Union” are to be construed as including the United Kingdom, the Channel Islands and the Island;
 - (b) references to “national” (where used as an adjective) are to be construed as including the United Kingdom, the Channel Islands and the Island;
 - (c) references to the “United Kingdom” are to be construed as including the Channel Islands and the Island;
 - (d) references to a “competent authority” or “relevant authority” are to be construed as references to the Department of Environment, Food and Agriculture; and
 - (e) references to a “third country” are to be construed as references to a country or state other than the Island, the United Kingdom and the Channel Islands.
- (2) The EU regulations, EU decisions and EU tertiary legislation prescribed under regulation 3(1) are to be construed and have effect subject to any contrary provision contained in or having effect under the customs arrangements between the United Kingdom and the Island.
- (3) Despite any provisions to the contrary in the EU regulations, EU decisions and EU tertiary legislation prescribed under regulation 3(1), such EU regulations, EU decisions and EU tertiary legislation do not impose any obligation on the Department of Environment, Food and Agriculture to provide –
 - (a) any funding to any person, body or organisation; and
 - (b) any information to any person, body or organisation,unless that Department decides otherwise.

5 Construction

To avoid doubt, any retained EU law is to be construed and have effect subject to these Regulations.

*EXPLANATORY NOTE**(This note is not part of the Regulations)*

Regulation 3 of, and the associated Schedule to, these Regulations prescribe the EU regulations, EU decisions and EU tertiary legislation, which form part of Manx law on and after exit day. For ease of reference the EU regulations, EU decisions and EU tertiary legislation specified in the Schedule are organised by the following policy areas —

- Part 1 – Agricultural Trade;
- Part 2 – Animal Diseases;
- Part 3 – Animal by-products and animal slaughter;
- Part 4 – Animal feed;
- Part 5 – Animal movements and animal welfare;
- Part 6 – Aquaculture;
- Part 7 – Dairy products;
- Part 8 – Fisheries;
- Part 9 – Food information, labelling and standards;
- Part 10 – Food safety;
- Part 11 – Genetically modified organisms;
- Part 12 – Importation of animal products from third countries;
- Part 13 – Plant health and plant protection;
- Part 14 – Product standards for trade (on behalf of the Office of Fair Trading);
- Part 15 – Residues;
- Part 16 – Timber and wood; and
- Part 17 – Zootechnical standards.

Regulation 4 to these Regulations specifies the interpretation provisions to be applied when interpreting the prescribed EU regulations, EU decisions and EU tertiary legislation after exit day. These interpretation provisions may be enhanced or superseded by regulations made under section 12 of the European Union and Trade Act 2019.
