## **EMERGENCY POWERS (PROHIBITIONS ON MOVEMENT) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 2020**

*Laid before Tynwald: 31 March 2020*  
*Approved by Tynwald: 31 March 2020*  
*Coming into operation in accordance with regulation 2*

The Governor in Council, by Order, makes the following Regulations under section 4 of the Emergency Powers Act 1936<sup>1</sup>.

### **1 Title**

These Regulations are the Emergency Powers (Prohibitions on Movement) (Amendment) Regulations 2020.

### **2 Commencement**

These Regulations come into operation immediately after they are made.<sup>2</sup>

### **3 Amendment of the Emergency Powers (Prohibitions on Movement) Regulations 2020**

In regulation 3 of the Emergency Powers (Prohibitions on Movement) Regulations 2020, in the definition of “**emergency or necessary voluntary service**” at the end add –

- (h) the Isle of Man Coastguard;
- (i) the Isle of Man Civil Defence Corps; ■.

<sup>1</sup> Section 4(1) specifies that "Where a proclamation of emergency has been made, and so long as such proclamation is in force, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, by Order, to make regulations ...".

<sup>2</sup> By virtue of section 4(2) of the Emergency Powers Act 1936, the Regulations made under this Order must be laid before Tynwald within 7 days of being made and only continue in force beyond 7 days of being so laid if Tynwald passes a resolution to that effect.
