## **EMERGENCY POWERS (CORONAVIRUS) (FIXED PENALTY) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 2020**

*Laid before Tynwald: 28 April 2020*  
*Approved by Tynwald: NOT MOVED*  
*Coming into Operation in accordance with regulation 2*

The Governor in Council makes the following Regulations under section 4 of the Emergency Powers Act 1936.

### **1 Title**

These Regulations are the Emergency Powers (Coronavirus) (Fixed Penalty) (Amendment) Regulations 2020.

### **2 Commencement**

These Regulations come into operation immediately after they are made<sup>1</sup>.

### **3 Emergency Powers (Coronavirus) (Fixed Penalty) Regulations 2020 amended**

In the Schedule to the Emergency Powers (Coronavirus) (Fixed Penalty) Regulations 2020<sup>2</sup> (fixed penalty notices), for entry 2 (relating to the Emergency Powers (Coronavirus) (Events and Gatherings) Regulations 2020<sup>3</sup>) substitute —

*EXPLANATORY NOTE*

*(This note is not part of the Regulations)*

These Regulations are made by the Governor in Council under section 4 of the Emergency Powers Act 1936 and following a proclamation of a state of emergency under section 3 of that Act.

The Emergency Powers (Coronavirus) (Fixed Penalty) Regulations 2020 provide that certain specified offences under or specified in regulations made under the Emergency Powers Act 1936 in response to the state of emergency may be offences for which a fixed penalty notice may be given. A fixed penalty notice offers the person alleged to have committed the offence an opportunity to discharge any liability to conviction for the offence by the payment of a fixed penalty. The amount of the fixed penalty in relation to the fixed penalty offences specified in these Regulations is £150 if paid within 14 days of the date of the notice, otherwise £250.

These Regulation add to the list of offences for which a fixed penalty notice may be given the offence of intentionally taking part in a gathering (within the meaning of Emergency Powers (Coronavirus) (Events and Gatherings) Regulations 2020, as amended).
