## EMERGENCY POWERS (PROHIBITIONS ON MOVEMENT) (AMENDMENT) (NO. 3) REGULATIONS 2020

*Laid before Tynwald: 28 April 2020*

*Coming into Operation in accordance with Regulation 2*

The Governor in Council makes the following Regulations under section 4 of the Emergency Powers Act 1936.

### 1 Title

These Regulations are the Emergency Powers (Prohibitions on Movement) (Amendment) (No. 3) Regulations 2020.

### 2 Commencement

These Regulations come into operation immediately after they are made<sup>1</sup>.

### 3 Emergency Powers (Prohibitions on Movement) Regulations 2020 amended

- (1) The Emergency Powers (Prohibitions on Movement) Regulations 2020<sup>2</sup> are amended as follows.
- (2) In regulation 3 (interpretation), before the definition of “home” insert —  
**“leisure activities”** does not include the participation in a sporting activity with persons who are not in the household of the person or an activity in a vessel, unless the vessel is moored; and **“**
- (3) In regulation 5 (exceptions from regulation 4: general) —
  - (a) in paragraph (1) —
    - (i) in sub-paragraph (b), omit “for basic necessities”;

- (ii) after sub-paragraph (b) insert —
    - ▮(ba) in order to take waste or recyclable produce to a civic amenity site ; ▮;
  - (iii) in sub-paragraph (c), for “one form of exercise per day”, substitute ▮exercise or a leisure activity ▮;
  - (iv) after sub-paragraph (f), insert —
    - ▮(fa) in order to provide assistance to a member of the person’s immediate family, provided that the person must not enter the property of that other family member; ▮;
  - (v) in sub-paragraph (g), after “family” insert ▮or to visit a grave ▮;
- (b) for paragraph (3), substitute —
- ▮(3) For the purposes of paragraph (1)(c) —
    - (a) the exercise or leisure activity must only be undertaken alone or with one or more members of the person’s household; and
    - (b) every person undertaking the exercise or leisure activity must ensure, as far is reasonably practicable, that a distance of at least 2 metres is maintained between the person and a member of his or her household and any other person who is not a member of that household. ▮;
- (c) after paragraph (6), insert —
- ▮(7) A person using private transport (including a taxi) may only share that private transport with members of his or her household, and in the case of a taxi, with members of his or her household and the driver. ▮.
- (4) In paragraph 7 (transport) of the Schedule (essential services), after “the movement of freight”, insert ▮, and those involved in the operation of a taxi service ▮.

*EXPLANATORY NOTE**(This note is not part of the Regulations)*

These Regulations are made by the Governor in Council under section 4 of the Emergency Powers Act 1936 and following a proclamation of a state of emergency under section 3 of that Act.

These Regulations are made for the purpose of securing the essentials of life to the community of the Island and for the protection of the economy of the Island.

These Regulations amend the Emergency Powers (Coronavirus) (Prohibitions on Movement) Regulations 2020 (“principal regulations”).

They permit a person to leave his or her ordinary place of residence for the following purposes —

- (a) to go shopping, for food, medicine and any other goods;
- (b) to undertake exercise or a leisure activity;
- (c) in the case of key workers (workers in essential services listed in the schedule to the principal regulations), to take their child to and collect the child from a person caring for their child;
- (d) to provide assistance to a member of the person’s immediate family (including to carry out household chores or deliver shopping to that family member).

The Regulations do not limit the time that a person may be out of the house for these activities, nor limit the number of times a person may leave his or her normal place of residence. However, exercise or leisure activities must only be undertaken alone or with one or more members of the person’s household; and every person undertaking the exercise or activity must ensure, as far is reasonably practicable, that a distance of at least 2 metres is maintained between the person and his or her household and any other person who is not a member of that household.

The Regulations also permit the use of taxis or private vehicles but persons must not travel in such vehicles with anyone other than members of their household (and the driver, in the case of a taxi).
