The Governor in Council makes the following Regulations under section 4 of the Emergency Powers Act 1936.

1 Title

These Regulations are the Emergency Powers (Coronavirus) (Closure of Businesses and Other Premises) (Amendment) (No.4) Regulations 2020.

2 Commencement

These Regulations come into operation —

- (a) for the purposes of regulation 3(2)(a), on 4 May 2020;
- (b) for the purposes of regulation 3(2)(b), on 2 May 2020; and
- (c) for all other purposes, immediately after they are made¹.

3 Emergency Powers (Coronavirus) (Closure of Businesses and Other Premises) Regulations 2020 amended

- (1) The Emergency Powers (Coronavirus) (Closure of Businesses and Other Premises) Regulations 2020² are amended as follows.
- (2) In Part 1 of the Schedule (businesses and premises that must close) —
 - (a) for entry 20, substitute —

- 20 (20) Any clubhouse which serves a golf course provided that in any case where a clubhouse includes the shop, office or other facilities to which a member must report prior to playing golf, that part of the clubhouse may remain open for that purpose only 20; and
- (b) for entry 21 substitute –
- 21 (21) Any premises that provide recreational fishing activities if –
- (a) the premises are –
- (i) a vessel (within the meaning of section 83(1) of the Harbours Act 2010), unless the vessel is moored, berthed or otherwise fastened within a harbour or at the place at which the vessel is ordinarily kept within the Island; or
- (ii) operated on a commercial basis or owned by a person other than a Department or Statutory Board and a payment (other than a licence fee payable to a Department) is charged in order to take part in the recreational fishing activities; or
- (b) the recreational fishing activities are competitive 21.
- (3) In Part 2 of the Schedule (businesses and premises that may remain open for restricted purposes) in the premises column of the entry relating to “Any civic amenity site”, after “recyclable” insert 22 products 22.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations are made by the Governor in Council under section 4 of the Emergency Powers Act 1936 and following a proclamation of a state of emergency under section 3 of that Act.

These Regulations are made for the purpose of securing the essentials of life to the community of the Island and for the protection of the economy of the Island.

These Regulations amend the Emergency Powers (Coronavirus) (Closure of Businesses and Other Premises) Regulations 2020 (“the principal regulations”) so as to permit golf courses to open provided that clubhouses may only open in specified circumstances and recreational angling in all cases other than (1) fishing from any type vessel (which includes boats and kayaks) unless that vessel is moored, berthed or fastened (2) at facilities which are commercial or owned by a person other than a Department or Statutory Board and for which a payment (other than the licence fee) is payable and (3) in the context of an angling competition.

These Regulations also inserted a missing word in Part 2 of the Schedule to the principal regulations, in relation to recyclable products.

These Regulations come into operation for the purposes of regulation 3(2)(a), on 4 May 2020, regulation 3(2)(b) on 2 May 2020 and for all other purposes, immediately after they are made.
