



EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES (ISLE OF MAN) ACT 1973

**CÔTE-D'IVOIRE SANCTIONS (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS
2011**

Laid before Tynwald 12 April 2011
Coming into operation in accordance with regulation 2

The Council of Ministers makes these Regulations under section 2B of the European Communities (Isle of Man) Act 1973¹.

1 Title

These Regulations are the Côte-d'Ivoire Sanctions (Amendment) Regulations 2011.

2 Commencement

These Regulations come into operation immediately after they are made.

3 Amendment of the Côte-d'Ivoire Sanctions Regulations 2005

The Côte-d'Ivoire Sanctions Regulations 2005² are amended as follows—

- (a) In regulation 1(2), for the definition of “the EC Regulation” substitute—
““the EC Regulation” means Council Regulation (EC) No 174/2005³ of 31 January 2005 imposing restrictions on the supply of assistance related to military activities to Côte d'Ivoire of 31 January 2005, as amended by Council Regulation (EU) No 1032/2010⁴ of 15 November 2010 of 15 November 2010 amending Regulation (EC) No 174/2005 imposing restrictions on the supply of assistance related to military activities to Côte-d'Ivoire, as these instruments have effect in the Island⁵;”;

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations amend the Côte-d'Ivoire Sanctions Regulations 2005 to take account of the amendment of the European Communities (Côte-d'Ivoire Sanctions) (Application) Order 2005 (SD 159/05) by European Union (Côte-d'Ivoire Sanctions) (Application) (Amendment) Order 2011 (SD 138/11). The 2005 Regulations established offences and penalties for breaches of Council Regulation (EC) No. 174/2005, as applied to the Island by the 2005 Order, and provided for the licensing by the Treasury of certain activities.
